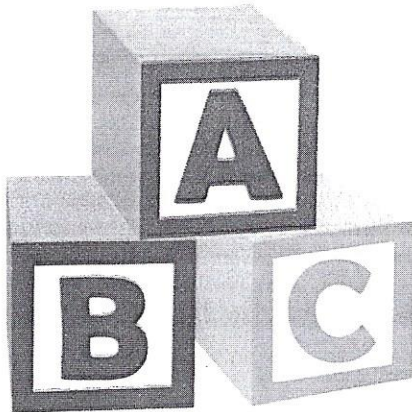


A Summer Reading 2020 Poem from Mrs. Clendinning (with form on page 2)

Cereal Boxes, Baseball Cards, a Recipe!

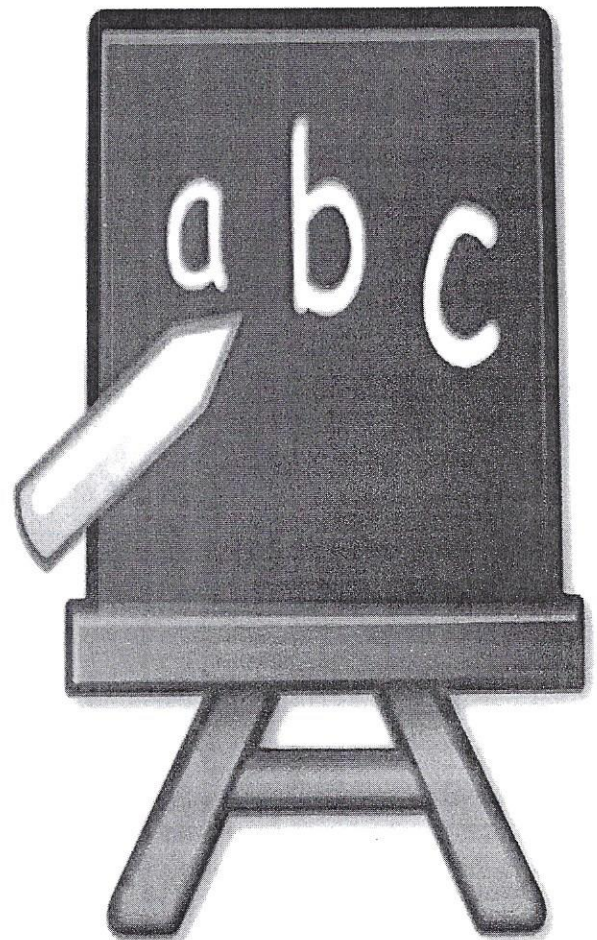
No books in the house? Where do you look?
